#### Fighting for the Gospel: We Are At War

- Throughout the New Testament, Paul uses military language to describe the Christian life.
- In light of God's gracious purposes, Paul gives Timothy one final charge: Fight for the gospel!

## I. Fight the Good Fight By Remembering Your Calling (1:18)

- Timothy was to engage in battle for the sake of **truth**.
  - Paul had charged him to this task. (1 Tim. 1:18)
  - o God had gifted him for this task. (2 Tim. 1:6)
  - The elders had commissioned him in his task. (1 Tim. 4:14)
  - o The **church** had confirmed he was up to the task. (Acts 16:2)
- All Christians are spiritual soldiers who must fight for the gospel.
  - Christian soldiers do not **flirt** with sin. They flee from it. (1 Tim. 6:11-12)
  - Christian soldiers are willing to endure suffering. (2 Tim. 2:3)
  - Christian soldiers seek to please the Commander who enlisted them. (2 Tim. 2:4)
  - Christian soldiers must wear spiritual **armor**. (Eph. 6:11-20).
  - Christian soldiers must wield spiritual **weapons**. (2 Cor. 10:3-5)

#### II. Fight the Good Fight by Holding to Faith and a Good Conscience (1:19)

- We must fight for the gospel in our lives.
  - Hold on to the faith: We must embrace **healthy** doctrine.
  - Maintain a clear conscience: We must pursue a <u>holy</u> life.
- We must avoid shipwrecking the faith and hurting the reputation of Christ.
  - Christian teachers must be good **soldiers**.
  - Christian teachers must also be good <u>sailors</u>.

## III. Fight the Good Fight to Avoid Spiritual Catastrophe (1:20)

- We must fight for the gospel in our churches.
- No one is immune to the temptation to **wander** from the gospel.
- Those who abandon the faith must be removed from the church.
  - Excommunication: Church discipline is necessary for church health:
    - These two men were cast out of the **church**...
    - To show that they were separated from **Christ**...
    - With the hope and prayer that they would **realize** their error...
    - And through God's discipline return to Christ.
  - o Exhortation: Whatever you do, hold on to the gospel.
    - Only the gospel can unite the church.
    - Only the gospel can sustain God's people during difficult days.
    - Are you failing? Are you faltering? Are you fleeing? Or are you fighting?
