- Many passages in Scripture instruct us to imitate godly **leaders** (Phil. 4:9; Heb. 13:7).
- The point is that, according to Scripture, all Christians should grow in Christ, imitate other godly Christians, and encourage others in their growth in Christlikeness.

Why is it important?

- Promoting biblical discipleship and growth is important because none of us are finished products.
 Until we die, all Christians will struggle against sin, and we need all the help we can get in this fight.
- If a church neglects discipleship and growth, or teaches a skewed, unbiblical version of it, it will
 discourage genuine Christians and wrongly assure false Christians. On the other hand, if a
 church fosters a culture of Christian discipleship and growth, it will multiply believers' efforts to
 grow in holiness.
