### What is Membership?

According to the Bible, church membership is a commitment every Christian should make to attend, love, serve, and submit to a **local** church.

- A vine with many branches.
- A body with many <u>members</u>.

#### Where is it in the Bible?

- Membership in a local church is not biblically <u>commanded</u>.
- Membership in a local church is biblically **implied**.
  - Membership is implied by church <u>gatherings</u>. (Acts 2:41-47)
    - The church is both universal and local. (Matt. 16:16-19; 18:17-19)
    - The local church is a **visible** expression of the universal body of Christ.
  - Membership is implied by church discipline. (Matt. 18:15-20)
    - Excommunication of members.
    - In order to be put **out** of the church, you must first be **in** the church. (1 Cor. 5:12-13)
  - Membership is implied by church **leadership**. (Heb. 13:7)
  - Membership is implied by church accountability.
    - We **love** one another. (1 Peter 2:17)
    - We encourage one another. (1 Thess. 5:11; Heb. 10:24-25)
    - We **guard** one another. (Heb. 12:15-16; 1 Cor. 5:1-5)
    - We obey our leaders. (Heb. 13:17)

#### Why is it important?

Biblical church membership is important because the church presents God's witness to himself in the world. It displays his glory. In the church's membership, then, non-Christians should see in the lives of God's changed people that God is holy and gracious and that his gospel is powerful for saving and transforming sinners.
