"The Circle of Life"

Ecclesiastes 1:1-11

Trust the Words of a Man Who Tried it All (v. 1)

- He sat in the highest position.
- He possessed the greatest wisdom.
- He was the most gifted, yet came away from life empty-handed.

Life Without God is Empty (v. 2)

- Life is like a vapor of breath (hebel)
 - Life is <u>fleeting</u>. It is passing quickly.
 - Life is **futile**. It produces no lasting results.
 - Life is **foggy**. It is unknowable.

Work Apart From God Is Pointless. (v. 3-4)

- Apart from God, none of man's work brings any **meaning**.
- Despite all of man's work, in the end he gains <u>nothing</u>.
- With each passing generation, this problem never goes away.
 - o Non-Christians: To live is pointless, and to die is **loss**.
 - o Christians: To live is Christ, and do die is gain.

We See the Meaninglessness in the Cycles of Creation. (5-7)

- When Adam fell, **creation** fell. (Romans 8:20-21)
 - When a believer looks at creation, he rejoices.
 - When an unbeliever looks at creation, he remains **hopeless**.
 - The sun- an endless race with no finish.
 - The wind- an endless journey that never <u>arrives</u>.
 - The sea- an endless stream that never **fills**.

The Things We Want Most In Life Only Make Us Weary (v. 8)

- Two Universal Laws:
 - Law of Unfulfilled Expectations- What we desire can't fulfill us.
 - Law of Diminishing Returns- What we get delights us less and less.
- Saint Augustine was right:
 - "Our hearts are restless until they rest in Thee."

Ultimate Meaning is Not Found in What is New (v. 9-10)

- There is no ultimate meaning in progress, inventions, or new accomplishments.
- There is nothing new under the sun that will **satisfy** our souls.

Face the Facts: In the End, Nothing Will be Remembered (v. 11)

- Life under the sun is redundant life.
- Jesus came to give abundant life.

"Only one life, twill soon be past; Only what's done for Christ will last."

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
