Ecclesiastes 6:1-12

#### At the Heart of the Matter is the Matter of the Heart

- Ecclesiastes does not <u>lack</u> the gospel.
- Ecclesiastes shows us our <u>need</u> for the gospel.
  - We all have the same problem: We are sinners.
  - At the root of our discontentment with life is sin.
  - o A discontented soul apart from Christ will never be satisfied.

We are half-hearted creatures, fooling about with drink and sex and ambition when infinite joy is offered us, like an ignorant child who wants to go on making mud pies in a slum because he cannot imagine what is meant by the offer of a holiday at the sea. We are far too easily pleased."

## The God-Shaped Hole: God Has Not Built Life for Anything Apart from Him to Satisfy. (6:1-6)

- The inability to enjoy the good life apart from God is a heavy burden on mankind.
  - No one is exempt from this reality.
  - No one can <u>escape</u> this reality.
- God can give you everything you want and then keep you from enjoying it.
  - <u>Lots</u> of money won't bring ultimate satisfaction.
    - Your bank and your barns can be full while your soul remains **empty**.
  - o A large family won't bring ultimate satisfaction.
  - o A **long** life won't bring ultimate satisfaction.
    - This man lives a frustrated life.
    - This man dies a **lonely** death.
    - The stillborn child is better off than an old man who dies unsatisfied.
      - Both are a **tragedy**.
      - Both end in death.
    - No matter how long you live, everyone is headed for the **grave**.

# Our Work Cannot Provide Ultimate Satisfaction. (6:7-9)

- All our work goes to feed our mouths.
  - You may feast today, but you'll be <u>hungry</u> again tomorrow.
  - You will go back to work to feed your mouth to fill your stomach but never be full.
  - Our deepest needs are spiritual, not physical.
- Until you are content with what you have, you'll never be satisfied with **more**.

### **Our Words Cannot Change This Reality.** (6:10-12)

- Man cannot argue with God about his limitations... just ask <u>Job</u>.
- Man cannot talk enough to unravel life's mysteries... just ask **Solomon**.
  - What is morally right? "Who knows what is good for man?"
  - What is life's purpose? "... the few days of his vain life, which passes like a shadow?"
  - What does the future hold? "Who can tell man what will be after him under the sun?"
- Only one man can satisfy our souls... just ask <u>Jesus</u>.
