The Bad Samaritan

John 4:13-26

Jesus the All-Satisfying Living Water: Every Person Needs Jesus (4:13-15)

- The Samaritan woman failed to see the nature of her true thirst.
- The living water Jesus offered is for the inner person.
 - You cannot drink this water with your **mouth**.
 - You must drink this water with your **heart**. (John 7:37-38)

Jesus the Sin-Revealing Prophet: Every Person is a Sinner (4:16-19)

- Jesus reveals the woman's sin to help her see her need for him.
 - o He knows her **public** past. "You have had five husbands."
 - He knows her **private** present. "The man you live with now is not your husband."
- The woman realizes that Jesus must be a prophet.

Jesus the New and Better Temple: Jesus is the Object of our Worship (4:20-24)

- The woman asks a question about worship. (20)
 - The important question is not **where** people worship.
 - The real issue is **who** and **how** people worship.
- Who?- Jesus addresses her confusion about worship. (21-22)
 - The temple was passing away as the focal point of worship.
 - Jesus had replaced the temple with his body. He is the new meeting place with God. (John 2:19)
 - Worship is no longer about a place, but a **person**.
 - We worship the **Father**.
 - We worship the **Son**.
- **How?-** Jesus explains the essence of true worship. (23-24)
 - o The Father is seeking those who will worship Him in **spirit** and in **truth**.
 - Jesus is the way the Father is seeking worshipers.
 - Jesus is God seeking the worship of God.
 - Real worship comes from the spirit within and is based on true views of God.
 - Spirit- You must be born of the spirit to worship God. (John 3:5)
 - Truth- You must come to God through the truth that is Jesus. (John 14:6)
 - Real worship involves both the **heart** (spirit) and the **head** (truth).

Jesus the Sin-Bearing Messiah: Jesus Saves Us From Our Sin (4:25-26)

- Jesus was the living water to satisfy her soul.
- Jesus was the prophet who revealed her sin.
- Jesus was the temple and the object of her worship.
- Jesus was the Messiah who had come to **save** her from her sin.
 - He died for our sins as our substitute.
 - Salvation is not found at a temple but at the **cross**.
 - He rose from death as our Lord and Savior!
 - Our hope is not found in empty rituals, but in an empty tomb.
