The Kindness and Severity of God

Judges 10:6-18

The Slavery of Idolatry (10:6)

- Idolatry leads to **enslavement**.
- Slavery leads to **idolatry**.

Sold: When God Gives His People What They Want (10:7-9)

- God judges sinners by giving them what they want: life without God.
- The judgment for idolatry is **idolatry**. (Romans 1:18-32)

When You Need to Repent from your Repentance (10:10-16)

- It is possible to turn from idolatry in an idolatrous way.
- Two signs of real repentance:
 - A sorrow for sin, rather than just for its consequences.
 - o A sorrow over idolatrous **motives**, not just behavioral changes.
- Remember **Esau**. (Hebrews 12:16-17)
 - We must be careful not to weep for missing the blessings of God when we have no taste for God.
- Our hope does not rest in the sincerity of our repentance but in the intensity of God's compassion.
 - His holiness demands that he judge his people.
 - His heart moves him to **spare** his people.

Repentance in Hope of a Rescuer (10:17-18)

- The first word of the gospel is repent. Jesus said, "Repent, or perish." (Luke 13:3)
 - We cannot **hide**. God will judge even the secret motives of our heart.
 - We must be **humble**. We are no better than anyone else and deserve wrath.
 - We have **hope**. God is merciful to those who repent and believe the gospel.
 - Christ lived the perfect life that we failed to live.
 - Christ **died** for sins of which we must repent.
 - Christ **arose** from death which we deserved.
 - Christ will **save** those who completely trust in him.

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
