Othniel: The Spirit-Filled Deliverer God's People Did Not Deserve (7:7-11)

- The sin of God's people required a **savior**.
 - o Their sin was evil in God's sight because of their idolatry.
 - o They forgot the Lord because they were spiritually indifferent.
 - o Their sin angered the Lord because of their immorality.
 - o The result: Sin led to slavery.
- The cry of God's people resulted in <u>salvation</u>.
 - This judge came from the tribe of **Judah**.
 - o This judge came to save those who call on the Lord's name.
 - o This judge came in the power of the **Spirit**.
 - This judge secured **peace** for God's people from their enemies.
 - The result: God's people are saved.

Ehud: The Left-Handed Deliverer God's People Did Not Expect (7:12-30)

- God raised up an <u>unlikely</u> hero to rescue his people.
 - Ehud was left-handed. He could have possibly been disabled.
 - Ehud wielded a two-edged sword kept hidden on his right thigh. (16)
- God gives glimpses of a greater hero.
 - Ehud was zealous for the glory of God. (19)
 - Ehud sounded a trumpet to call the people to himself. (27)
 - Ehud's call to God's people was "Follow me." (28)
 - Ehud's victory was complete: No one escaped his judgment. (29)
 - Ehud brought about <u>rest</u> for God's people. (30)

Jesus: The True Deliverer All People Desperately Need

- In spite of our sin, God sent a Savior we did not deserve...
 - A lion from the tribe of Judah to lead God's people.
 - A rescuer of sinners who call upon the name of the Lord.
 - A prophet who preached the gospel in the power of the Spirit.

 - A conquering king who defeated death through his resurrection.
- Because of God's grace, we must trust in this Savior we could never expect...
 - He had nothing in his appearance that we should desire him, despised and rejected by men.
 - He was an outsider born in a manger who came not in strength, but in weakness.
 - He preached a message considered by the world not as wisdom, but as foolishness.
 - He delivered his people not through great victory, but through crushing **defeat**.
 - The judges died and brought temporary peace. Jesus died and rose to bring eternal **rest**.
