 - God opposes oppressive nations.
 - God humbles the proud.
 - God destroys the wicked.
- Nahum reminds us that God cares about the **suffering** of his people. (2)
 - God will always defend the righteous.
 - God will always uphold justice.

II. The Attack on Nineveh (2:3-5)

- Nahum proves God will make <u>war</u> with his enemies.
 - He will always keep his word.
 - He will always win.

III. The Agony of Defeat (2:6-12)

- Nahum causes us to tremble at God's wrath against sin. (6-8)
 - The plunderer becomes the plundered. (9-10)
 - The predator becomes the prey. (11-12)

IV. The Announcement from God (11:13)

- Nahum encourages us to be more grateful for <u>Jesus</u>.
 - o In our sin, God is against us.
 - o In Christ, God is for us.
